The "A" Train Corner Alstott honored for his outstanding career!



October 19, 2008

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) -- **Mike Alstott**, pg. 438, brought the Tampa Bay crowd to its feet one more time.

The former Buccaneers fullback, one of the most popular players in the franchise's history and its career leader in several categories, was honored with a ceremony at halftime of Tampa Bay's game against the Seattle Seahawks on Sunday night.

Alstott was the final person to run from the tunnel when the starters were announced, and served as an honorary captain, wrapping Buccaneers coach Jon Gruden in a bear hug shortly before kickoff.

"Pads on or pads off, I get emotional every time," Alstott said. "Being able to go out there and break that huddle and fire up the guys one last time -- dreams come true. ... I couldn't ask for anything better. You couldn't write it any better."

The Bucs' cheerleaders all wore No. 40 jerseys for the game, as did thousands of fans, and two huge flags bearing Alstott's number swayed at midfield for the halftime ceremony.

"It was an honor to describe his great career," longtime Bucs play-by-play voice Gene Deckerhoff said. "And it was a thrill every time I was able to say, 'Al-stott! Up the gut! Touchdown, Tampa Bay!"

Alstott was presented with two framed jerseys -- including the very one he wore in 1996, in the team's former creamsicle-orange color scheme that had his name spelled "Alsott" on the back. The other jersey was from his last game with the Buccaneers.

"Beautiful piece," Alstott said. "Puts the beginning to the end together."

He was also feted with several taped tributes played on the video screen throughout the evening, including ones from former teammates, along with stars like Terrell Davis, Marshall Faulk and Cal

Ripken Jr.

"You're a great player and a great man," Florida Gov. Charlie Crist said.

Alstott choked up during the ceremony, stopping his speech after only a few seconds because of cheers from the crowd.

"You guys are the best," Alstott said, after composing himself.

A six-time Pro Bowl selection, Alstott retired this year after a 12-year career. He's dropped some weight since retirement, and said he feels fine, even though his neck -- which was problematic throughout his career -- isn't yet as strong as he would like.

"My body feels great, knees, everything," Alstott said.

He was one of the mainstays of the team that delivered the franchise's only Super Bowl championship, and set career club records for touchdowns (71), TDs rushing (58) and Pro Bowl appearances by an offensive player. In 12 seasons, he rushed for 5,088 yards, caught 305 passes for 2,284 yards.

"I love you and I will miss you," Alstott said, closing his remarks.

THE NEW DOCTOR: Lower costs played a big role in specialist's decision to move to small town in Texas

Dr. Daniel Altstatt, (pg. 286) had been in Brownwood, Texas, just two weeks when 71-year-old Ruby Collier came to his office with urinary problems.

Nurses had diagnosed her with a bladder infection. But the problem

wasn't that simple.

"He said, 'Ma'am, you don't have a bladder infection, you have kidney cancer,' "Ms. Collier recalled.

Now, nine months after Dr. Altstatt removed her cancerous kidney, Ms. Collier is fine. "He's a marvelous doctor," she said.

He's also a doctor who wouldn't have been there to treat her if not for the state's 2003 cap on malpractice damage

"I wouldn't be in Texas if it weren't for tort reform,' Dr. Altstatt said.

Before Dr. Altstatt came to Brownwood, the town had no urologist; the nearest was 67 miles away, in

Dr.Altstatt - who's 38, a native of Tennessee a graduate of Pennsylvania State University and a father of two considered job offers from Pennsylvania to Mississippi after finishing his residency.

The fact that Brownwood, population 19,000, is small was a plus, he said. The doctor grew up in a town of 500.

But as a businessman, he also didn't ignore the bottom line.

For one thing, the Brownwood job offered a salary 13% higher than the one

in Mississippi.

Second, Dr. Altstatt said, he would have paid \$60,000 in yearly malpractice insurance in Mississippi, which has a \$500,000 cap on noneconomic damages. In Texas, he expects to pay less than \$2,000 this year.

Folks in Brownwood feel lucky he's there.

"Recruiting specialists in a rural community is difficult, always has been difficult," said Matt Maxfield, chief executive of Brownwood Regional Medical Center. He's still searching for an orthopedist, obstetrician and

radiologist.

Only five of every 100 orthopedists, for example, will move to a community of fewer than 50,000 people, Mr. Maxfield

Brownwood is short on incentives to lure big-city talent – there is no symphony or five-star restaurant – but malpractice limits help, he said.

In wooing Dr. Altstatt, the hospital administrator offered a set salary until he could build a patient roster large enough to cover the overhead.

But at the end of the day, "someone has to want the quality of life offered in a small community," Mr. Maxfield said.

Luckily for Ms. Collier, Dr. Altstatt did.

She was in intensive care for three days after the doctor removed her kidney. Now she sings Dr. Altstatt's praises.

"She thinks I walk on water,' he said. "But honestly, it's nothing any other urologist wouldn't do."

If you can find one.
