# Descendants of Caspar Altstadt (1673) can now trace the family back another 44 year to 1629!

On our latest jaunt to the protestant archives in Kassel, Hermann Altstadt and I were able to track the Altstadt/Altstatt family back another 50 years to the birth of Margaretha Altstatt, wife of **Hermann Altstatt** in 1629.

Yes, Altstatt - which seems to be the earliest spelling in this Altstadt line, by Raboldshausen church records - and the preferred spelling of Martin Altstatt when he immigrated to America in 1729.

Last year, the Kassel records listed Allenstadts, Altenstadts and Altstadts living in Allmershausen and Kolkobes around 1610 to 1635. These towns were only 15km east of Raboldshausen.

Were these spelling variations of one related family? See page 6.

James spent the 1973-74 school year at Andes Central High School, where he was head wrestling coach and assistant coach for an undefeated football team that gave up points

He served as defensive coordinator on a Stevens team that ended the 1974 season ranked No. 1. He later became the Rapid City Junior High athletics director. He coached six football seasons at

the collegiate level at the South Dakota School of Mines & Technology, serving the 2000 and 2001 seasons as associate head coach.

In 2007, he received the Rapid City Officials Club Sports Hall of Fame Contributor Award. In 2009 was awarded the Ralph Ginn Award.

She lived in Hudson for more than 80 years and was known by many as "The Bicycle Lady." The people of Hudson were very kind to her and she loved living there, according to a family member.

Mrs. Alstott was preceded in death by her husband John Alstott. She is survived by her daughter Jacqueline (William) Edwards, her son Jeffrey, her brothers John, Samuel, and Richard Gaylord, and her sister Phyllis. She is also survived by three grandsons David, Jonathon and Kyle and her four great granddaughters Hannah, Madison, Sophia, and Samantha.


Raboldshausen in 1701: baptismal, burial and marriage notice: January 14, Margretha, Hermann Altstatt 's widow was buried, died Jan. 12, between 7 am - 8 p.m, 72 (LXXII) years old. Note: (Thus she was born in 1629! – maybe in Raboldshausen? Allmershausen? Kolkobes! – who knows?!)

Raboldshausen Church Confirmation entries for Margaretta AltStatt and her sister, Eva Christina Altstatt.

Margaretta's last name is spelled in two words -Alt'- old and Statt - town. The only reference we have ever seen where a capital letter "S" is used for Statt in the middle of a name.

Caspar Altstadt (Altstatt) was born in Raboldshausen in 1673, Margaretta AltStatt in 1680 and Eva Christina Altstatt in 1683. Enough age similarity to project that Margaretta and Eva were younger sisters to Caspar Altstadt.

As names seem to be handed down through the generations, two of Caspar Altstadt's daughters, born at Dreieichenhain, were named Eva Margaretha Elisabetha Altstädt (1718) and Anna Christina Altstadt (1721) ...coincidence!!!!



In the 16th Century, German Dukes either followed Roman Catholic edicts or Martin Luther's new protestant dictates. The demarcation line at that time between the two differing Christian views in Hessen was at Burghaun and stretched westward. North of the redish-brown boundary (above) was Protestant Hessen - below was Catholic Hessen.

In former Catholic times, all the above area was overseen by the Fulda Diocese. Most of the early Catholic records we have found were at Hunfeld. From Hunfeld the Altstadts spread out to Grossenbach, Fulda, and westward to Grossenlüder.

Early 17th century Protestant records have been found at Kolkobes and Allmershausen, small villages near Bad Hersfeld, before spreading out to Raboldshausen, Burghaun and Fraurombach.

Records for the area around Schlitz (green line), Protestant habitation for Altstadts, is in the archive at Darmstadt and will have to wait for another trip.

Our 2014 Genealogy search was centered around the Bad Hersfeld areas of Kolkobes, Allmershausen, Raboldshausen, along with Fulda, Grossenlüder and Schlotzau for the spellings, Allenstadt, Altenstadt, Altstadt and Altstatt.

# Genealogy wasn't the only fun thing we accomplished in 2014...Hermann and I had some great family visitations too!





July 30th, 2014 found me back across the pond with another stint at the Greater Europe Mission's Conference

in Willingen, Germany.
Willingen is only 20 kilometers
west of Kassel...which is home to the Protestant church records for the state of Hessen. So, on each Germany trip, I am able to mix "business" with "pleasure" - as Hermann and I are on a first name basis with the librarian there. *PS...her hobby is parachuting!! We don't mess with her!!* 

On this trip, **Hermann Altstadt** picked me up at the hotel in Willingen on August 8, and we headed west to Gilsen-Kirchen, to visit with Burkhardt Altstadt, a cousin of Hermann's. While there we had a really good visit and toured

at home and we enjoyed coffee cake and refreshments and a little gabbing on their patio.

The next day, we drove up to Kassel and spent a few days searching out the Altstadt families who lived around the Bad Hersfeld area in the early 17th century. And "viola," we came across old Raboldshausen church records from the late



1680s. And, YES, there were Altstatts living in the area at that time!...we were elated! Our results are documented on page 6. I don't think I need to repeat any further! Héading back to Fulda, we

spent a couple of days in the Catholic Archives there and found records of Altstadt families in Hunfeld, Fulda, Grossenlüder and Schlotzau.

This time we were able to copy entries for Anna, Georg and Francis Altstatt...the spelling in 1813, 1816 and 1819 was actually Altstadt.

Because of these findings, we have been able to put together Altstatt Grossenlüder ancestors from the area Hunfeld. We already knew that Grossenbach Altstadts had come from the same area. (Hunfeld is only 13 kM from Grossenbach). So, we feel that these findings place those who descend from the Grossenbach and Grossenlüder clans in the continued on page 8
